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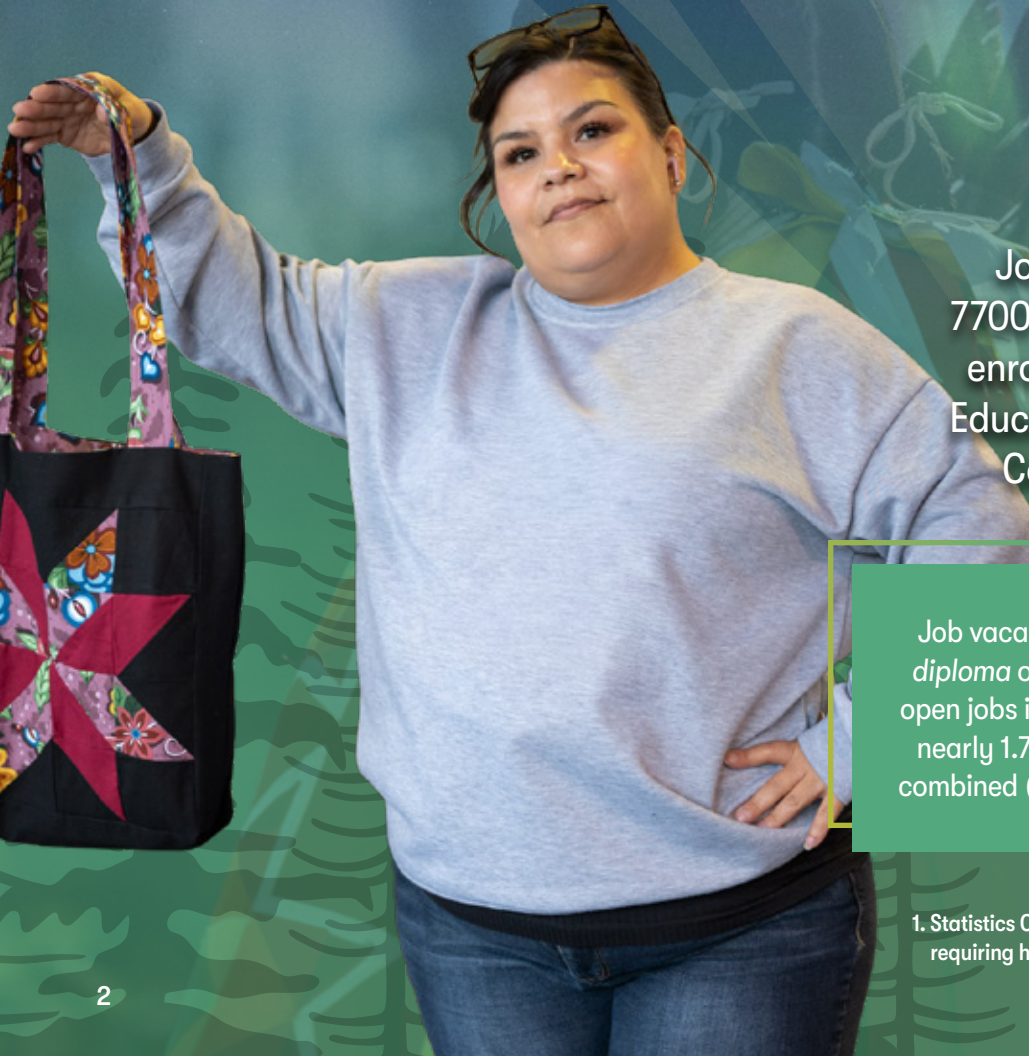

Love working on cars and trucks? This 36-week Automotive Service Technician program gives you the skills to succeed in dealerships, repair shops, and service stations. Develop problem-solving abilities, mechanical expertise, and transferable skills that open doors to related trades like heavy equipment and truck mechanics—all in less than a year.

Students in the Automotive Service Technician program will learn how to diagnose, repair, service, and maintain advanced mechanical and electrical systems in vehicles, and get plenty of practical, hands-on training.

Graduates of this program will receive a Level 2 credit towards apprenticeship, and acquire transferable skills that can be applied to other trades including: agricultural machinery technician, heavy duty equipment technician, truck & transport mechanic, among others.

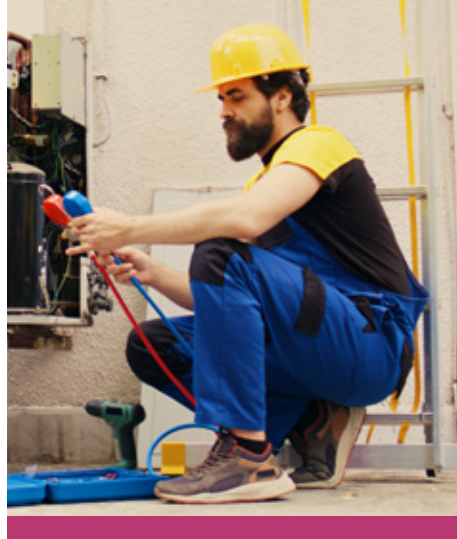

ADDICTIONS, COMMUNITY, AND MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL YEAR 1

AIR RONGE

Formerly known as the Mental Health & Wellness Program.

The Addictions, Community, and Mental Health Professional Program is a full-time, 2-year diploma that includes classroom instruction, counselling practice sessions, and field placements—where students learn to apply both Indigenous and western holistic approaches to healing for youth, adults, and seniors. It is designed to support students in developing the foundational skills and knowledge required to become professionals in the fields of addictions, community engagement, and mental health support.

Year 1 focuses on personal development & reflection, building self-awareness, and understanding one's role as a mental health professional in the communities they will serve.

INDIGENOUS PRACTICAL NURSING YEAR 2

One of the best things about this program was the incorporation of traditional knowledge into the curriculum: traditional medicines, smudging, and more. When I was in my clinical rotations for IPN, there was an elderly lady who was fluent in Cree, but didn't speak any English. She was crying and the nurses thought 'well she's maybe she's just confused'. Me, being a fluent Woodland Cree speaker, I was able to go in and ask her what was wrong, and she just needed a pillow because she was uncomfortable. Once they did that for her, she was so thankful. It was good to have an impact.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION YEAR 2

LA RONGE

Building on ECE Year 1, this program helps you design engaging, developmentally appropriate curriculum and learning environments. Explore literacy, arts, numeracy, and play, along with child guidance, inclusion, family partnerships, and program planning. You'll strengthen your skills of observation, documentation, and communication, preparing graduates to collaborate effectively with families and professionals.

Components of the program may be delivered using a hybrid model.

Graduates may find employment as educators in childcare centres, preschools, or as childcare centre directors. Career opportunities also include Early Childhood Intervention programs, Family Resource Centres, Kids First Programs, and more—or as a springboard to further education in these sectors.

INDIGENOUS PRACTICAL NURSING YEAR 2

LA RONGE

Completing this two-year, full-time diploma will prepare students to deliver culturally responsive care with integrated western and Indigenous health approaches. This program, brokered through the Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies, provides cutting edge classroom learning, enhanced labs, practicum, and preceptorship experiences, through which students gain skills to support diverse communities. Be the healer that your community needs, with less time in class and more time to make an impact. Clinical work placements may involve shift work, travel outside the community, and overnight stays.

Delivered in Air Ronge, SK, the program equips graduates to write the Canadian Practical Nurse Registration Exam (CPNRE) and pursue licensure with the College of Licensed Practical Nurses of Saskatchewan (CLPNS). As a Licensed Practical Nurse, you'll provide compassionate care to individuals, families, and communities across diverse settings and life stages.

The program can be taken on a full- or part-time basis, and students must complete the remaining three years of the Bachelor of Commerce degree in person with the University of Saskatchewan.
