PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Addictions, Community, and Mental Health Professional Program is a full-time 2 year diploma focused on holistic, culturally appropriate healing and addictions counseling. Brokered through SIIT, it blends Indigenous and Western approaches to prepare learners to support clients of all ages.

Year 2 builds on the first year by strengthening skills through classroom learning, counseling labs, simulations, and ongoing fieldwork—hands-on experience that is essential for professional competence and personal growth. The program may be delivered with in-person and remote instruction.

- A letter of intent for enrolling in program
